As a professor at the Department of Psychiatry and Psychotherapy, you (m/f/x) will strengthens in particular the research focus "Neurological-Psychological Diseases" and its interfaces with the cross-sectional profiles "Technology Development" and "Prevention" of the Faculty of Medicine.

Ideally, your research in animal models with translational relevance will strengthen the faculty profile with a focus on behaviour across the lifespan and the preclinical implementation of innovative technologies for individualized neuropsychiatric applications. We would like your participation in existing and future interdisciplinary research initiatives and cooperation with institutions at faculty/university level as well as non-university research institutions within the DRESDEN-concept research alliance. Active participation in the development of joint priority projects within the framework of the university's future strategies is expected. Furthermore, you are expected to support clinical research as part of the management of the laboratory for neurobioanalytics at the Clinic and Polyclinic for Psychiatry and Psychotherapy. You will represent the field of medical biology in accordance with the licensing regulations for the degree courses in medicine, dentistry and the model degree program in human medicine. Support for teaching in related B.Sc. and M.Sc. curricula is desirable. A particularly high level of commitment is expected in the promotion of young scientists, especially in the supervision of thesis and doctoral students. Here you are expected to integrate into existing national and international graduate schools with innovative concepts. We also welcome your willingness to take on academic self-administration tasks.

We are looking for a personality with national and international research experience, sound knowledge and extensive human and animal experimental methodological competence in the field of biological psychiatry, experience in leading an independent scientific research group and a willingness to engage in constructive, interdisciplinary collaboration in research and teaching. Ideally, as a future post holder, you will already have internationally visible publications related to your area of appointment, experience in acquiring competitive third-party funding. Teaching experience, particularly in human medicine in German, is a prerequisite. The prerequisites for appointment are a completed university degree in natural sciences (e.g. biology or biochemistry).





The requirements for appointment, the official duties and the administrative status are governed by §§ 59, 69, 71 of the Act on Higher Education Institutions in the Free State of Saxony (SächsHSG) and the Saxon Regulation on Official Duties at Higher Education Institutions (DAVOHS).
